Heart Failure also called Congestive Heart Failure (CHF) occurs when the right or left side of the heart is unable to pump blood at a sufficient rate which results in fluid overload in the lungs or body.

Given discharge instructions <a href="#">why is it important?</a> The staff at the hospital should provide you with information to help manage your heart failure symptoms when you are discharged. This includes: diet, weight monitoring, what to do if symptoms worsen, discharge medications, activity level and follow up appointment.	73%	90%	92%
Evaluation of left ventricular systolic function <a href="#">why is it important?</a> This assessment, usually by an ultrasound of your heart, checks how the left chamber of the heart is pumping.	97%	98%	99%
ACE Inhibitor or ARB for left ventricular systolic dysfunction <a href="#">why is it important?</a> ACE Inhibitors & ARBs are medicines used to treat heart attacks, heart failure or a decreased function of the heart.	99%	95%	96%
Smoking Cessation advice or counseling <a href="#">why is it important?</a> Smoking is linked to heart failure. Quitting may help prevent complications including heart attacks.	100%	99%	99%
